This year was one of hope... Hope that we will get over the storm that descended on the world in the form of Covid. It was with this hope that we began our academic year. The year passed by with few ups and downs, uncertainties of lockdown, joys of getting back together physically in the campus, eagerness of catching up with the pace of the year and the community growing stronger.

Highlights of the pandemic year...

- 1. A year of 3-Jun-2021, we began the academic year with the Government imposed lockdown, few weekly touch-points, staying in touch with the subject and motivating each other.
- 2. Sep-2021, we resumed our regular 5-day rhythm at Udhbhavaha. It was a joy for children, parents and teachers to get back into action in the physical space.
- 3. The different tracks of Aarogya, Aesthetics and Academics resumed with full vigor.
- 4. Ayurveda was introduced as a new subject for older children.
- 5. Udhbhavaha Responsibility Groups Parents and teachers together formed about 6 responsibility groups to take on the various responsibilities here and ensure smooth functioning which included administrative activities, academic research, cultural strengthening, fund raising, exploring small scale business and outreach programs.

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- 6. Children participated in the Paddy sowing and entire life cycle activities of the Paddy planting at Gauribidanur
- 7. Gopura group (10 to 13 year olds) visited the Western Ghats for a stream tracing activity and enjoyed the adventures that came along with it.
- 8. Children visited the Sawan Durbar Ashram in Uttarahalli Road and experienced the natural jaggery-making process there.
- 9. Manthan, our monthly parents meet, brought in thought provoking discussions around modernity and its influence on education and our life, the essence of community and the thought process required to be part of a community, the role of academics in one's life.

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- 10. We had about 5 Parichaya events this year where we introduced and walked through Udhbhavaha to outsiders, few of them who have now become part of the community as a parent or teacher
- 11. Prof. C.K. Raju, a renowned Mathematician and educationist voraciously talks about the Western influence on the approach to Math and Sciences and raises glaring anomalies in the school/ college textbooks. Festivals this year...

- A small puja was done in Udhbhavaha by the younger children on the occasion of Varamahalakshmi puja
- Krishna Janmashtami was celebrated with abhisheka to Krishna followed by Tottilu Seve. Different versions of Mosaru Madike (Dahi Handi) games were also part of the celebrations.
- 3. Children of Udhbhavaha made Ganesha Murtis out of clay which were installed during the Ganesha Chaturti celebrations. After the puja, the Murtis were carried out in procession and were immersed in our Holi Pond.
- 4.Parents and Teachers of our community came together to chant all the 18 Adhyayas of Bhagawad gita as part of Gita Jayanthi and offered it to Sri KS Narayanacharya. We also went to a nearby Srinivasa Temple and children offered the Adhyayas they have learnt to the deity.

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- 5.We had Saraswati Puja and Lakshmi Pooje for Dasara and Deepawali celebrations respectively as part of Kala Sandhya.
- 6.Sankranthi Habba, the annual community festival of Udhbhavaha was celebrated with great zest amidst growing uncertainties of Covid lockdown. The harvest festival at Gauribidanur had rashi puja, gau puja and surya arghya. Children and teachers added a step to the harvest song 'Suggi kala higgi bandhiitu' around heaps of harvest. We also had a folk music performance by an artist.
- 7.On the occasion of Maha Shivarathri, we performed a simple puja at our campus and later visited a nearby Shiva Temple, where children chanted Shlokas and sang Bhajans they had learnt.

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- 8. Holi celebrations started with all of us coming together and preparing natural colors using Haldi, Kumkum and Beetroot. We played with natural colors and the celebrations continued in our Holi Pond. Just before sunset we prepared the idol of Kamanna, took it out in a procession and lit fire to it. Celebrations ended with a Fire Walk for teachers and parents.
- 9. We went to the Ramohalli Rama Temple to celebrate Rama Navami. Children of Gopura-4 offered their learning to Rama by chanting Moola Sankshepa Ramayana(Complete Ramayana in 100 shlokas) which in a way was also the Pareeksha of their learning conducted by our Sanskrit Teacher Harish Anna.


